democracy and extremism are usually considered as opposites we assume that our system in the uk the usa the netherlands etc is democratic and extremists try to destroy our system and introduce some kind of dictatorship if not chaos and anarchy yet in many cases the extremists seem sincere in their attempt to construct a more democratic polity hence they can be called democrats and yet also extremists in so far as they strive for a regime with characteristics that are more extreme in a significant sense this book analyses radical and extreme democratic theories and ideas in their historical context interlocked with critical descriptions of historical institutions and experiments that help to evaluate the theories cases range from ancient athens to recent experiments with citizen juries and citizen assemblies from the time honoured swiss landsgemeinde to contemporary and controversial workers councils in venezuela and participatory budgeting in porto alegre among the theorists discussed here are familiar names as well as relatively unknown persons jean jacques rousseau and karl marx murray bookchin and john burnheim william godwin and barbara goodwin anton pannekoek and heinz dieterich whereas the extreme ideas do not seem to work very well in practice they do indicate ways by which we could make existing political systems more democratic this book will be of interest to students of politics and current affairs as well as inspiration to political activists and reformists

culture has an abiding influence on the way countries and business corporations are governed this book introduces the reader to the deep philosophies that drive corporations and governments in east asia from china through japan and south korea to singapore with sparkling clarity and spiced with anecdotes and case studies it depicts how respect for cultures can lead to spectacular success or the lack of it to failure confucian practices such as guanxi in chinese society the benevolent culture of entity firms in japan and patriarchal chaebols in south korea are analyzed with examples like esquel nissan and samsung a delightful chapter on daoism shows how it drives jack ma s alibaba com in the governance of nations the author reinforces burke s dictum that systems of government must be consonant with traditional cultures and he calls out misguided attempts by the west to foist liberal democracies on civilizations in the east where respect for authority and communitarian values come before individual interest the author advances the novel concept of the meritocratic democracy in which leaders are chosen not by electoral popularity but by proven ability in a thought provoking concluding chapter he evaluates prospective constitutional changes in china that would enshrine meritocratic democracy as an alternative to liberal democracies that have turned dysfunctional in many western nations

a searching examination of what citizen competence is how much it exists in the united states today and what can be done to increase it

this book presents a critique of dominant governance theories grounded in an understanding of existence as a static discrete mechanistic process while also identifying the failures of theories that assume dynamic alternatives of either a radically collectivist or individualist nature relationships between ontology and governance practices are established drawing upon a wide range of social political and administrative theory employing the ideal type

method and dialectical analysis to establish meanings the authors develop a typology of four dominant approaches to governance the authors then provide a systematic analysis of each governance approach thoroughly unpacking and critiquing each one and exploring the relationships and movements among them that engender reform and revolution as well as retrenchment and obfuscation of power dynamics after demonstrating that each governance approach has fatal flaws within a diverse global context the authors propose an alternative they call integrative governance as a synthesis of the ideal types integrative governance is neither individualist nor collectivist while still maintaining the dynamic character required to accommodate responsiveness to cultural contexts

this book analyzes united nations un interventions in the process of constitution making in states undergoing political change it combines theoretical considerations of democracy and constitutionalism with empirical experiences and takes a critical perspective on the interventions developed by the united nations in the processes of re democratization presenting new empirical evidence on the substantive and procedural way in which the un

undertakes constitution building in cambodia bosnia and herzegovina afghanistan and east timor the book illustrates difficulties of these practices such as the promotion of popular participation as well as an increasing westernization and to meet local needs in consequence the authors call for reforms of the actions and structural methods the un to better align a legitimate constitutional order with the rule of law and democratic values this book is aimed at scholars and students of politics and law who are interested in the prerequisites and conditions for further democratization in states undergoing political transformation

this book argues that contemporary liberal democracy is reaching a crisis brendan sweetman contends that this crisis arises from a contentious pluralism involving the rise of incommensurable worldviews that emerge out of the absolutizing of freedom over time in a democratic setting this clash of worldviews is further complicated by a loss of confidence in reason and by the practical failure of public discourse a contributory factor is the growing worldview of secularism which needs to be distinguished from both the process of secularization and the concept of the secular state after describing the crisis and exploring these themes and also rejecting proposed solutions from recent liberal political theory sweetman develops an approach to pluralist disagreement which requires a re envisioning of the relationship between religion secularism and politics and which allows a limited place for all worldviews in the state including religious worldviews engaging with the work of philip kitcher robert audi john rawls a c grayling martin luther king cécile laborde john stuart mill john locke and plato sweetman s approach is a formidable innovation in the quest to maintain a free and fair society

this book explores the concept of deference as used by historians and political scientists often confused and judged to be outdated it shows how deference remains central to understanding british politics to the present day this study aims to make sense of how political deference has functioned in different periods and how it has played a crucial role in legitimising british politics it shows how deference sustained what are essentially english institutions those which dominated the union well into the second half of the twentieth century until the post 1997 constitutional transformations under new labour while many dismiss political and institutional deference as having died out this book argues that a number of recent political decisions including the vote in favour of brexit in june 2016 are the result of a deferential way of thinking that has persisted through the democratic changes of the twentieth century combining close readings of theoretical texts with analyses of specific legal changes and historical events the book charts the development of deference from the eighteenth century through to the present day rather than offering a comprehensive history of deference it picks out

key moments that show the changing nature of deference both as a concept and as a political force

the principles of democracy freedom and the rights of individuals are taught from textbooks but the principles of autocracy and dictatorship are still practiced in most schools and homes it is no wonder our children feel unsettled defiant and even outright rebellious many of our young people are growing up ignorant of and uncommitted to the great principles upon which our nation was founded the way to make children committed to our democratic way of life is to make them full participants in it this new guide is provided to assist educators and parents in making our schools and homes models of democracy giving our kids the freedom of choice and bestowing on them the basic rights of citizenship parents and educators must unite as democratic leaders to guide coach and stimulate our young people to assume responsibility for themselves the future of our nation may depend on it
